I was born and raised in the Kansas City area, and for as long as I can recall, my family attended Our Lady of Good Counsel every Sunday for Mass. Msgr. William Blacet was my pastor for most of my life and had a great impact on my discernment. I began serving Mass for him at the age of 11. His reverence and simplicity in celebrating Mass was very inspiring. I started actively discerning around the age of 16. I went on a Come and See retreat to various seminaries. I was inspired by the joyfulness of the seminarians I encountered. I ended up applying to the seminary in my senior year and was sent to St. Gregory the Great Seminary in Seward, Nebraska, in the fall of 2015. I spent the next four years studying philosophy and graduated in the Spring of 2019.

The following fall, I was accepted to Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis for the next stage of formation. I studied Theology for two years before being sent on a Pastoral Internship at Our Lady of Guadalupe in St. Joseph in the summer of 2021. This was one of the most impactful years of formation. I got to experience parish life with all its ups and downs for about 15 months. It was a time of amazing growth.

I returned to the seminary in the fall of 2022 to complete my final two years of studies. I was ordained a transitional deacon on May 20, 2023, and have loved ministering for this past year. I look forward to ministering in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph as a priest of God!





All: Thanks be to God. (Applause)



GUIDELINES FOR RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

FOR CATHOLICS

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

FOR OUR FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21). Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 §4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of Communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 §3).

FOR THOSE NOT RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.


FOR NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.

Episcopal Motto: "CARITAS CHRISTI URGET NOS."
